About This Report

This report sets out how Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar University, Agra performs against Sustainable Development Goal 17, Partnerships for the Goals. It is structured to follow the metric framework in the THE Sustainability Impact Ratings Methodology 2026 rather than a general narrative order, so that each section answers a specific scored question and the evidence sits where an assessor would look for it.

SDG 17 occupies an unusual position in the ratings. It is the only compulsory Goal for inclusion in the overall table, which means every submitting institution is assessed on it. It also carries a smaller share of the final score than the other Goals a university chooses to submit. The practical consequence is that SDG 17 is where a university establishes its baseline credibility: partnership evidence, published SDG reporting and education provision are all visible here, and weakness in this Goal is visible to every assessor regardless of which other Goals are submitted.

Two things make the University's position on this Goal comparatively strong. The first is the MoU register. Ninety-three agreements are recorded and published, running from 2018 to 2026, with the signed instrument available for download in most cases. Fifteen of these are international, covering partners in the United States, the United Kingdom, the Netherlands, Canada, Russia, Ukraine, Uzbekistan, the Philippines, Australia and Austria. The second is that the University has published a separate report against every one of the seventeen Goals on its SDG portal, which is exactly what metric 17.3 asks for and which many institutions cannot demonstrate.

Where evidence is incomplete, the report says so. The bibliometric indicators at 17.1 need a Scopus extract that had not been consolidated when this draft was prepared, and Annexure D lists that gap alongside the others so they can be closed in one round of data collection. The photographic plates are marked placeholders; each names the image required and the address it should be taken from.

For each of the qualitative indicators in metrics 17.2, 17.3 and 17.4, the methodology awards up to three points: one for the existence of the activity, up to one for evidence provided, and one where that evidence is public. This report has been written with the third point in mind. Every item cited is already published on a University domain and can be opened by an assessor without credentials, which is the difference between two points and three.

SDG 17 Partnerships for the Goals

17.0 Institutional Position

Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar University approaches SDG 17 from a particular vantage point. It is an affiliating university of roughly two hundred colleges across the seven districts of the Agra Division, with fifteen residential institutes on four campuses. Partnership is not an add-on to its work; it is the basic mechanism by which the institution operates. What has changed over the past six or seven years is that these relationships have been formalised, documented and published rather than left as informal working arrangements.

The University builds partnerships with government bodies, civil society organisations, private sector firms, NGOs, industry and academic and research institutions, with the stated aim of equipping students to address sustainable development challenges and of upholding the principle of leaving no one behind. That framing comes from the University's own Goal 17 position paper and it is worth taking at face value, because the MoU register bears it out: the ninety-three agreements on file include hospitals and medical colleges, state utilities, footwear and scientific-instrument manufacturers, hotels, software firms, Hindi-language societies on three continents, and half a dozen NGOs working on tuberculosis, COVID-19 and nutrition.

Three features of the portfolio are worth drawing out before the detailed sections. First, its breadth of sector. The register is not dominated by academic twinning agreements; roughly half are with industry, government or civil society. Second, its geography. The international agreements reach beyond the usual Anglophone destinations to Ukraine, Uzbekistan, the Philippines and Russia, which matters for metric 17.1.1 because several of these are lower-middle income economies. Third, its durability. Most agreements run for five years rather than one, and several have documented follow-on activity attached to them in the register.

The 2023 figure stands out and has a straightforward explanation. That year the University conducted a systematic exercise to formalise working relationships that had previously been informal, particularly in the Institute of Tourism and Hotel Management, the Institute of Engineering and Technology and the K. M. Institute of Hindi and Linguistics. The register grew sharply as a result. What this means for reporting purposes is that the underlying partnership activity is older than the paperwork, and the earlier years understate rather than overstate the University's engagement.

WHEREAS, DBRAU and IBM have entered into discussions concerning IBM's provision of technology products and services for DBRAU;

NOW, THEREFORE, in order to ensure that the discussions and evaluations between the parties regarding the potential business relationship that is sought does not create any confusion or misunderstandings, the following items represent points that require the parties' agreement and will facilitate these evaluations and discussions.

1.Roles and Responsibilities

The proposed roles and responsibilities of the parties in connection with this proposed business relationship are described in Attachment 1.

2.Termination

This MoU will terminate within four (4) years from the date of execution of this MOU, unless extended or terminated earlier. If at any time any party wishes to withdraw from further evaluations and discussions in connection with the subject matter of this MoU and terminate this MoU, it may do so with or without cause and without liability by providing the other party with written notice of its intention to withdraw from further evaluation and discussions. All discussions, proposals, term sheets, draft agreements and other similar materials will be null and void if evaluations and discussions are terminated. This MoU can be extended upon written agreement of the parties.

3.Confidentiality

The existence and substance of this MoU and the provision of services contemplated hereby will be kept confidential and will not be disclosed to any third party without the prior written consent of the other party hereto. Notwithstanding the foregoing, any party may make such public disclosure

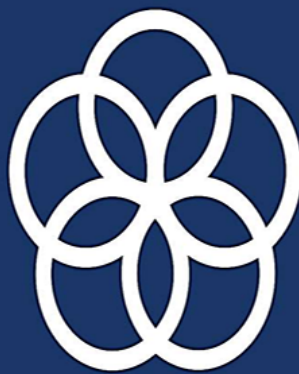

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About Us

Dr Bhimrao Ambedkar University

Formerly Known As **Agra University**

The foundation – of Dr Bhimrao Ambedkar University (originally known as Agra University) was laid on the 1st of July, 1927, as a result of hectic efforts of a band of enthusiastic educationists like Rev. Canon A.W. Davis, Munshi Narain Prasad Asthana, Dr L.P. Mathur, Lala Dewan Chand, Rai Bahadur Anand Swaroop and Dr Brajendra Swaroop.

Original jurisdiction of University extended over United Provinces of Agra, Central India and Rajputana with 14 affiliated colleges and 2530 students of which,

17.1 Research into Partnership for the Goals

Metric 17.1 is bibliometric. It is scored from Scopus data rather than from institutional submission, which means the University cannot influence it directly in a return, but it can and should know where it stands. The two indicators together carry 27.1% of the SDG 17 score, which makes this the single heaviest block in the Goal.

17.1.1 Output co-authored with low or lower-middle income countries

Indicator: Proportion of academic publications co-authored by someone from a low or lower-middle income country. Normalised; 13.55% of the SDG 17 score, 2.98% of the overall score.

Two points are worth making about this indicator before the numbers are filled in. The first is structural: India is itself classified by the World Bank as a lower-middle income economy. A large share of the University's co-authorship is with Indian institutions, and how that is treated in the normalisation materially affects the result. The IQAC should read the current Scopus SDG methodology note carefully on this point rather than assume.

The second is that the University's international partnership portfolio is unusually well positioned for this indicator, and largely by accident of academic interest rather than by design. Its formal agreements include Taras Shevchenko National University of Kyiv in Ukraine, the Uzbekistan State World Language University in Tashkent, and Pangasinan State University in the Philippines. All three sit in lower-middle income economies. Most Indian universities that pursue international partnerships aim at the United States, the United Kingdom and Australia, all high-income; the University's Hindi-language and area-studies interests have pulled it towards a rather different map.

That is a genuine comparative advantage on this metric and the University should build on it deliberately. Converting these agreements into co-authored output is the next step, and it is not automatic. An MoU that produces conferences and student exchange but no joint papers will not register here at all.

AGREEMENT
on research, educational and cultural cooperation
between

Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar University (Agra, India)
and
Taras Shevchenko National University of Kyiv (Ukraine)

Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar University (Agra, India) represented by Prof. Ashu Rani, Vice Chancellor, and Prof. Pradeep Shridhar, Head of the Department Of Hindi, Director of K.M. Institute of Hindi and Linguistics and Taras Shevchenko National University of Kyiv (Ukraine), represented by the Rector, Professor Volodymyr Bugrov, acting upon the Statute, hereinafter referred to as the "Parties", agree to sign the following Agreement on research, educational and cultural cooperation between the universities, basing on their university traditions and productive relations.

Article 1

The Parties, according to their Statutes and in the frameworks of the existing opportunities, shall develop the cooperation in different spheres of university life, politics and management on the basis of equality and mutual benefits, involving all members of the university community – lecturers, scientists, students, postgraduates and other researchers.

Article 2

The Parties shall organize the exchanges of visiting lecturers, methodological literature and scientific materials, information, scientific plans and programs.

Article 3

The Parties shall organize joint researches on the mutually agreed subjects, exchange of scientists, develop and support direct contacts between departments, laboratories, other scientific units.

The Parties shall inform each other about scientific events, which will be held in the Universities and invite representatives of the other Party to take part in these events.

Article 4

The Parties shall organize the exchanges of students, postgraduates and trainees, providing them with all necessary conditions to extend their theoretical and practical knowledge. The Parties within this agreement can enter into further

specific agreements/programmes for double degree diplomas between the universities.

Article 5

Both Parties agree that the most optimum form of cooperation is to establish direct relations between the interested parties in the specific fields which is based on the interest of a certain faculty (institute) or employee and in the most acceptable form for both Parties.

Article 6

This agreement does not exclude other types of cooperation which can be proposed for discussion by any Party. These types can also be supplemented or amended on the mutual written consent of both Parties. The amendments to this Agreement can take place only with the notice of the participants of this cooperation.

Article 7

To implement the provisions of this Agreement the Parties shall draw and approve Working cooperation programs for the term of 3 (three) years where the specific forms, scientific topics, terms and quotas of cooperation and also conditions of its organization and financing will be stated.

Article 8

This Agreement comes into effect on the day of its signing by the authorized representatives of both Parties and is valid for five (5) years or until one of the Parties expresses desire in written form to terminate it.

This agreement is concluded in two equally valid copies in English.

17.1.2 Partnerships for the goals: publications

Indicator: Scale of research output relating to SDGs 1 to 17. Not scaled by institution size. Normalised; 13.55% of the SDG 17 score, 2.98% of the overall score.

This indicator counts absolute volume rather than intensity, which is worth understanding because it changes what a university should do about it. Since the count is not scaled by institutional size, a large affiliating university with many departments has a structural advantage over a small specialist one. The University's fifteen residential institutes span engineering, basic sciences, life sciences, social sciences, commerce, law, home science, fine arts, tourism and vocational education, which is a wide enough spread that output maps onto most of the seventeen Goals somewhere.

The practical task is capture rather than production. Research is already being done across these institutes; what is inconsistent is whether it is indexed, correctly affiliated and therefore counted. Affiliation strings are the usual culprit. Where faculty publish under a departmental or college name without the full University affiliation, the output does not attach to the institutional record and is invisible to this indicator.

The University maintains a public research database covering publications, books and book chapters, patents, consultancy and MoUs, together with a dedicated research portal. Consolidating the Scopus-indexed subset of that database and reconciling it against the internal register is the action required here, and it should be done once for all seventeen Goals rather than Goal by Goal.

17.2 Relationships to Support the Goals

Metric 17.2 carries fifteen available points across five indicators, worth 18.50% of the SDG 17 score. Each indicator awards one point for the existence of the activity, up to one for evidence, and one where the evidence is public. The sections below are written to that structure, and every item cited is already published on a University domain.

17.2.1 Relationships with regional NGOs and government for SDG policy

Indicator: Direct involvement in, or input into, national government or regional NGO SDG policy development.

Response: Yes - evidenced through formal agreements with state agencies, participation in national policy programmes, and Chancellor-led review.

As a state university under the Uttar Pradesh Department of Higher Education, the University sits inside the government structure rather than alongside it. Its Chancellor is the Governor of Uttar Pradesh, and Chancellor-directed initiatives are transmitted to the University as policy instructions with expected implementation. This is a materially different relationship from the arms-length consultation model common in other systems, and it should be described that way in a submission rather than understated.

The clearest documented instance in the reporting period is the Chancellor's Ground Zero visit in September 2024, in which the Hon'ble Governor reviewed University activity directly on site. Separately, the webinar on Strategies for Enhancing Research Collaborations in Chemical Sciences was organised by the Department of Chemistry with the IQAC specifically under an initiative of the Hon'ble Governor and Chancellor, and addressed collaborative research, shared ownership of results, extramural funding and capacity building for young researchers.

At the operational level, the University holds formal agreements with several state agencies and public bodies. These are working agreements with delivery obligations, not statements of intent, and each is published with its signed instrument.

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17.2.2 Cross-sectoral dialogue about the SDGs

Indicator: Initiate and participate in cross-sectoral dialogue about the SDGs, for example conferences involving government or NGOs.

Response: Yes - through international conferences, national workshops and the G20 University Connect lecture series.

The methodology defines cross-sectoral dialogue as a collaborative effort in which parties from different societal sectors pool resources to address SDG-related issues. On that definition the University has a reasonable body of activity in the reporting window, and the strongest examples are those where academia, government and industry were in the room together rather than talking past each other.

XXXXI Annual Conference of the Indian Council of Chemists

Organised by the Department of Chemistry in collaboration with the Indian Council of Chemists, this brought more than three hundred national and international delegates to deliberate on developments in physical, inorganic, organic and analytical chemistry aligned to the sustainable development goals. It is the largest single convening the University has hosted in the period and the one that most clearly fits the cross-sectoral definition, since delegates came from academic institutions, research bodies and industry.

National Workshop on Intellectual Property with DRDO

A two-day workshop on Intellectual Property: Capturing, Acquisition and Management of Portfolio, run with DRDO and the Department of Zoology, brought experts from DRDO and from industry together with faculty and research scholars. Held in February 2024, it addressed IP acquisition and portfolio management, and it is a good illustration of the defence-research, academic and commercial sectors working on a shared problem.

G20 University Connect lecture series

During India's G20 presidency the University hosted lectures under the G20 University Connect programme, with a message from the Pro Vice-Chancellor and a public lecture series carried on the University's channel. Faculty and students also contributed to the Waste to Wonder initiative under several G20 engagement groups, work that is recorded in the awards register on the SDG portal.

International film festival on social themes

The Institute of Tourism and Hotel Management collaborated with Glamour Live Films, Mumbai, to organise an international film festival at which thirty-two international films from fifteen countries were screened, all carrying social messages. It is an unusual format for SDG dialogue and a genuinely effective one, since it reached an audience well beyond the people who attend academic conferences.

International Conference on Francophonie et Litterature

The Department of French organised an international conference on Francophonie et Litterature: etat actuel with AITF, AIEQ and the Bureau du Quebec, Mumbai, addressing linguistic diversity, cultural cooperation, higher education and research partnerships between countries.

17.2.3 International collaboration on gathering data for the SDGs

Indicator: Participate in international collaboration on gathering or measuring data for the SDGs.

Response: Partial - strong national data infrastructure participation; international data collaboration is an identified development area.

This is the indicator on which the University's position is weakest, and the report states that plainly rather than stretching the evidence. What exists is substantial participation in national data infrastructure and one clear international data relationship; what does not yet exist is formal membership of an international SDG data initiative.

On the national side, the University's 2025 agreement with INFLIBNET, the UGC inter-university centre for information and library network, connects it to the national scholarly data infrastructure and to the One Nation One Subscription programme. The University makes annual AISHE returns, submits to NIRF, and operates Samarth, the national higher-education management platform, for admissions, examinations and student services. Its research database, publications register, patents register and MoU register are all published openly, which is itself a form of data contribution.

On the international side, the UNICEF and Community Radio Association partnership is the most substantive. Community Radio 90.4 FM worked with UNICEF and the CRA on risk communication and community engagement during COVID-19, and this involved structured community-level data gathering and reporting against a framework set by an international agency. The Hindi-language partnerships with institutions in the Netherlands, Canada, the United States, the United Kingdom and Russia involve comparative linguistic documentation, which is data gathering in the humanities sense even if it does not look like SDG indicator work.

The IQAC's recommendation, recorded here so that it is on the institutional record, is that the University should seek membership of an international SDG data platform such as the UNU-IAS SDG University Platform or a comparable network. That would convert a partial answer into a full one on this indicator and would also strengthen 17.2.4.

A Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was made and entered into on **25 (Day) January (Month) 2025 (Year)** between the INFLIBNET Centre, an IUC of University Grants Commission located at Gandhinagar, hereinafter referred to as **"INFLIBNET"** and **Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar University, Agra (Uttar Pradesh)** (University / Deemed University / Inter- University Centre / Others), here in after referred to as the 'University'.

This Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) & the amendments define the rights, responsibilities, liabilities and commitments of the Institutions involved in ensuring proper system implementation, to meet the objectives pertaining to submission and access to Shodhganga (Electronic Theses and Dissertations) as envisaged by the UGC and other bodies vide:

- The circular issued by AICTE vide circular No. AICTE/P& AP/Misc/2022/ Dated: 23.12.2022 & UGC vide D.O.No.2-10/2021 (CPP-II) dated December 22, 2021
- Amendments suggested by the Shodhganga National Steering Committee [SNSC] in its meeting held on 21st August 2024, at the INFLIBNET Centre.

17.2.4 Collaboration for SDG best practice

Indicator: Through international collaboration and research, review comparative approaches and develop international best practice on tackling the SDGs.

Response: Yes - through international academic agreements, comparative conferences and inter-university exchange.

The University's fifteen international agreements are the primary evidence here. What makes them relevant to best-practice review rather than simply to exchange is that most are framed as mutual transfer of academic activities, which in practice means comparing how two institutions approach the same problem and adopting what works.

The K. M. Institute of Hindi and Linguistics has built the most developed international network, with partners in the Netherlands, Canada, the United States, the United Kingdom and Russia, and has published activity records showing what those relationships have produced rather than simply that they exist. That distinction matters for scoring: an agreement with a follow-on activity record is stronger evidence than an agreement alone.

The 2026 agreement with IBM India Private Limited is worth noting separately as the University's first significant technology-industry partnership at this scale, and the Khwaja Moinuddin Chishti Language University agreement of the same year links two Uttar Pradesh institutions whose Vice-Chancellor is himself an alumnus of this University.

17.2.5 Collaboration with NGOs for the SDGs

Indicator: Collaborate with NGOs to tackle the SDGs through student volunteering programmes, research programmes, or development of educational resources. Points are awarded per option selected, so all three routes should be evidenced.

Response: Yes - all three routes evidenced: student volunteering, research programmes and educational resource development.

The methodology awards 0.33 points for each of the three routes, so a university that can evidence all three secures the full existence point. The University can, and the sections below are organised to make that visible rather than leaving an assessor to infer it.

Route 1: student volunteering programmes

The National Service Scheme is the principal vehicle. NSS units across the University and its affiliated colleges run village and ward adoption programmes covering sanitation, health awareness, literacy, plantation and disaster response, working alongside local NGOs. The University's NSS work received the NSS National Award for 2021-22 from the Minister of Youth Affairs, Government of India. NCC units and Bharat Scouts and Guides operate on the same model. Students for Development, a national agreement signed in 2024, provides a further structured volunteering channel.

Route 2: research programmes

The SMART NGO partnerships are the clearest example. Four separate agreements between 2021 and 2022 covered tuberculosis, COVID-19 and nutrition, each involving community-level work with a documented activity record. The International Centre for Climate and Sustainability Foundation agreement, signed in 2023 for five years, provides a research channel on climate and sustainability specifically. Koshambi Foundation and India Resources Trust add further research and outreach capacity.

Route 3: development of educational resources

Community Radio 90.4 FM is the University's main educational-resource platform for NGO collaboration. Working with UNICEF and the Community Radio Association, and separately with SMART NGO and Yara Fertilizers, the station has produced public education programming on health, vaccination, nutrition and agriculture. Programming of this kind reaches audiences that print and classroom materials do not, which is the point of having a broadcast licence attached to a university.

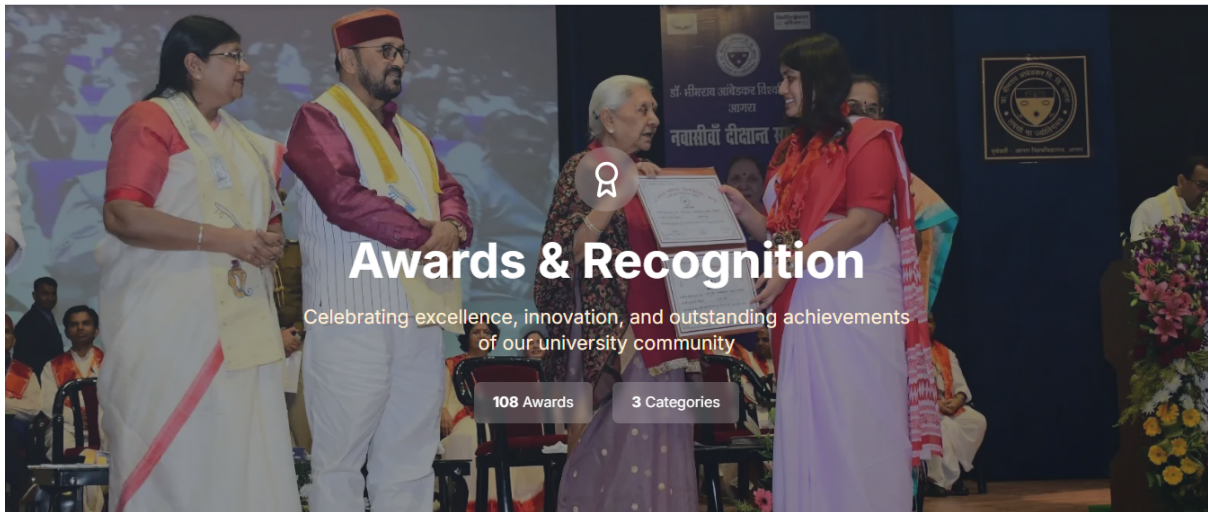

University Outreach Programme

Dr. S. Radhakrishnan, the eminent educationist and former President of India once said that "All education is, on the one side, a search for truth; on the other side, it is a pursuit of social betterment. The University and the colleges provided their students the implements to shine wherever they go and flourish in whatever they do.

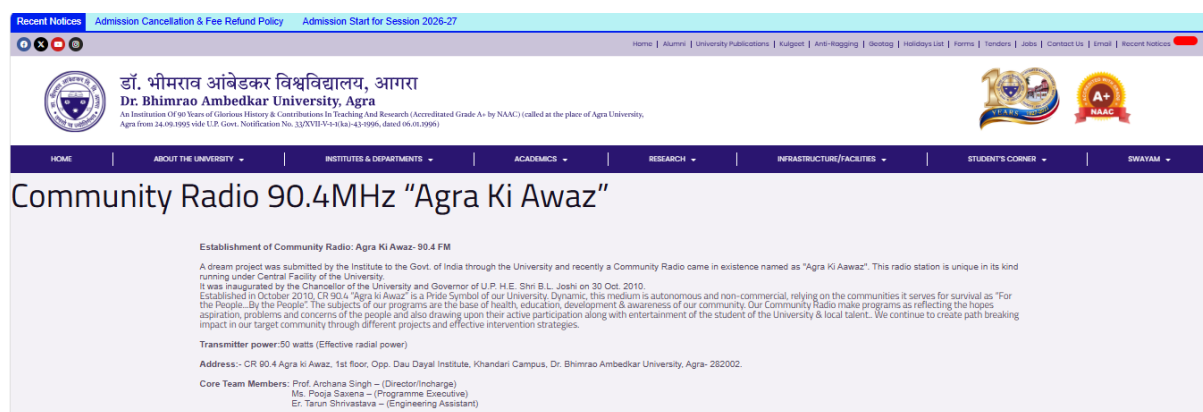
What are Outreach Programmes

Outreach is an activity of providing services to populations who might not otherwise have access to those services. A key component of outreach is that the groups providing it are not stationary, but mobile; in other words they are meeting those in need of outreach services at the locations where those in need are. In addition to delivering services, outreach has an educational role, raising the awareness of existing services.

Outreach is often meant to fill in the gap in the services provided by mainstream (often, governmental) services, and is often carried out by those who have zeal, enthusiasm, passion, motivation and determination for social services.

The term outreach, which applies to community outreach and outreach counseling and refers generally to "efforts to increase the availability and utilization of services, especially through direct intervention and interaction with the target population.

The Community Outreach Program gives students the opportunity to get involved in community service on a regular basis.



17.3 Publication of SDG Reports

Indicator: Publish progress against each of the SDGs, either individually or within an annual report. Scored per Goal at 1.60% of the SDG 17 score each, 27.20% in total.

Response: Yes - a separate public report is published for all seventeen Goals on the University SDG portal.

This is the University's strongest position in SDG 17 and it deserves to be stated without hedging. The University operates a dedicated SDG portal at dbrausdg.in, separate from the main institutional website, on which a report is published for every one of the seventeen Goals. Each Goal has its own page carrying the targets, indicators, initiatives and gallery, together with a downloadable PDF report. The scoring structure makes this worth understanding precisely. Metric 17.3 awards up to three points per Goal: one for the existence of a report, up to one for evidence provided, and one where that evidence is public. With seventeen Goals at 1.60% each, the metric is worth 27.20% of the SDG 17 score, which ties it with education as the largest submitted-evidence block in the Goal. An institution that publishes reports for only a handful of Goals forfeits most of it.

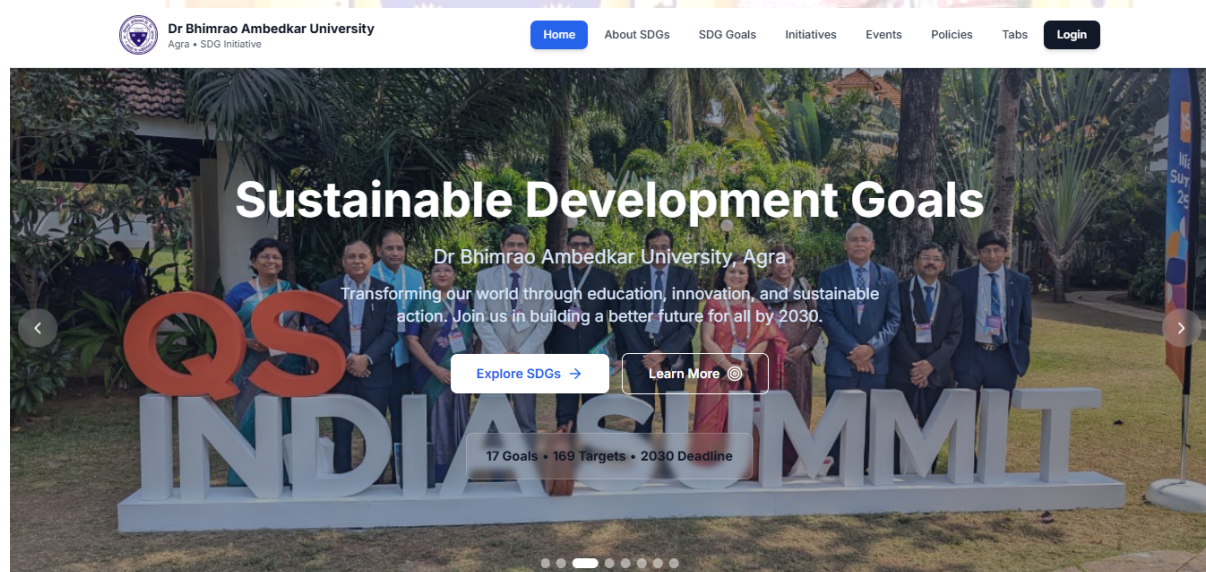
Two cautions are worth recording. First, the methodology states explicitly that previous Impact Ratings performance or submissions do not by themselves count as a report for this measurement, so the University's SDG portal reports must stand on their own content. They do. Second, the guidance requires the report to have been published in the most recent or relevant academic year, so the IQAC should confirm and record the publication or last-revision date of each Goal report before submission.

The portal carries supporting material alongside the Goal reports: an SDG-mapped policy framework that lets a reader filter University policies by Goal and theme, an awards and recognition register, a financial report section, and an events and initiatives area. The policy filter is a genuinely useful piece of design, because it answers the question an assessor actually has, which is not whether a university has policies but whether any of them bear on a particular Goal.



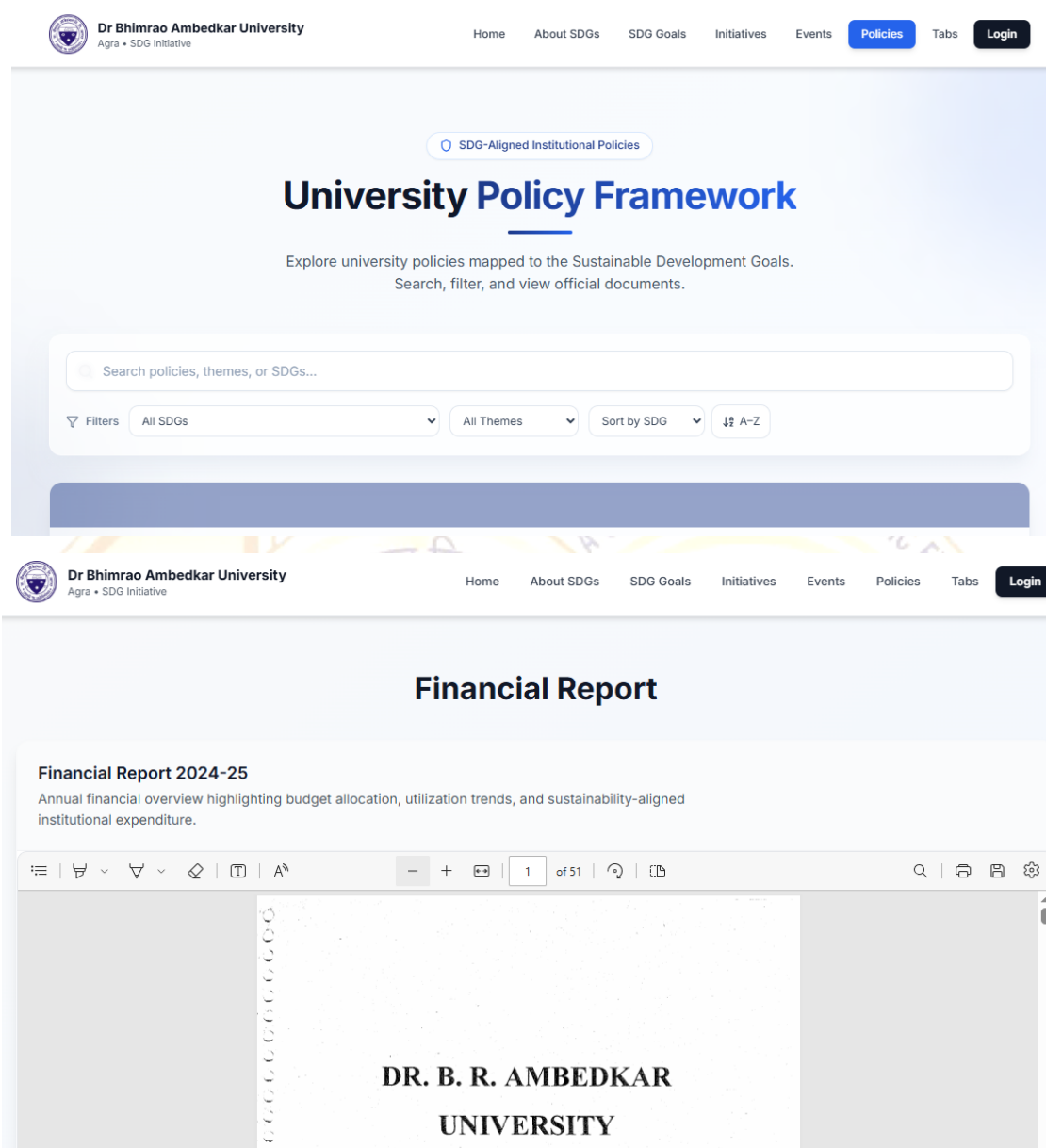
University SDG portal - reports published for all seventeen Goals

A candid note on the portal

Two sections of the portal, Initiatives and Events, were returning empty at the time this draft was prepared, and the impact counters on the home page were displaying zero. This is a presentation problem rather than a substance problem, since the underlying activity is documented elsewhere on the University site, but an assessor checking the portal will see it. Populating those sections and the counters is listed in Annexure D as a priority action, and it is a low-cost one relative to the 27.20% of the Goal score that this metric carries.

17.4 Education for the SDGs

Metric 17.4 carries nine available points across four indicators and is worth 27.20% of the SDG 17 score, equal to metric 17.3. Three of the four indicators are scored; the fourth, on sustainability literacy measurement, is collected in 2026 but not scored. The metric relates to UN Targets 17.16 and 4.7.

17.4.1 Commitment to meaningful education around the SDGs

Indicator: A commitment to meaningful education around the SDGs across the university, relevant and applicable to all students. Scored at one point for education integrated across the full curriculum, 0.66 for mandatory education for all, 0.25 for optional education for all.

Response: Yes - sustainability and human values education is embedded across the curriculum through the NEP 2020 structure, supported by mandatory co-curricular provision.

The scoring distinction here is sharp and worth reading carefully, because the gap between a full point and a quarter point is large. Integration across the full curriculum scores one point. Mandatory

education for all students scores 0.66. Optional provision for all students scores only 0.25. The University's evidence supports a claim at the upper end, but that claim has to be made precisely and backed by the syllabus documents.

The National Education Policy 2020 framework, which the University has implemented across its programmes, restructures degrees so that every student takes co-curricular and value-added components alongside their major. Co-curricular courses are a required part of the NEP degree structure rather than an elective add-on, and the University publishes the syllabus for these separately from the disciplinary syllabi. That structural feature is the strongest part of the University's case on this indicator: sustainability and human-values content is not sitting in an optional module that a determined student can avoid.

Supporting this, the Human Value Cell carries a University-wide brief on ethics and values education, and the Indian Knowledge System Cell works on integrating Indian knowledge traditions into curriculum and research. The Ethical Values Policy provides the governing framework. A five-day faculty development programme on Inculcating Universal Human Values in Technical Education, run with AICTE New Delhi, was recognised in the University's awards register for 2023, which evidences that the commitment extends to staff development rather than student-facing provision alone.

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Human Value Cell

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Indian Knowledge System Cell

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In alignment with NEP 2020 to conserve Indian Knowledge System, the University has integrated IKS curriculum across disciplines. Following UGC guidelines, an IKS cell develops curricula and pedagogy tailored to Indian context, ensuring exposure for every student. Pre-Ph.D. coursework encourages IKS-focused research. The University has an extensive collection of historical manuscripts, maps, and coins from 7th to 8th centuries, reflecting commitment to preserving cultural heritage. The University Art Gallery exhibits paintings and artifacts by Fine Arts faculty and students, fostering cultural awareness. Students apply innovative research in crafting sculpture items, showcasing creative thinking.

17.4.2 Specific courses on sustainability

Indicator: Dedicated courses, whether full degrees or electives, that address sustainability and the SDGs.

Response: Yes - dedicated programmes and catalogued courses across several institutes, with syllabi published.

The methodology guidance for this indicator asks for specific catalogued courses, which means the evidence needs to be course listings and syllabi rather than a general statement that sustainability is taught. The University publishes its full NEP syllabus set publicly, broken into undergraduate, postgraduate, research-wing, vocational and skill development, co-curricular and value-added categories, so the raw material for a precise return already exists.

Provision falls into three groups. Degree programmes with sustainability at their core sit in the Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Institute of Rural Development, which teaches rural and peri-urban development, and in the School of Life Sciences and the Institute of Basic Science, which cover environmental science, ecology and pollution. Programmes with substantial sustainability content include those in the Institute of Engineering and Technology, the Institute of Home Science, the Institute of Tourism and Hotel Management, which teaches sustainable tourism, and the Department of Contemporary Social Studies and Law.

The third group is the skill and vocational provision, which is where the University's industry partnerships feed directly into teaching. The Dau Dayal Institute of Vocational Education ran a webinar on data science with Coding Blocks covering descriptive, diagnostic, predictive and prescriptive analytics. The Technology Based Entrepreneurship Development Programme was run with the MSME Technology Development Centre and the Central Footwear Training Institute, Agra, training students under a government entrepreneurship initiative. Agreements with TCS iON, Zoho, IBM, Skillyards, Internshala and Aspire Knowledge and Skills all carry a teaching component.

The action needed here is straightforward but not yet done: extract from the published syllabi a definitive list of courses that address sustainability and the SDGs, with course codes, credits and the Goal each maps to. That list should be published on the SDG portal, which converts a two-point answer into a three-point one because the evidence becomes public.

17.4.3 Education for the SDGs in the wider community

Indicator: Dedicated outreach educational activities for the wider community, which could include alumni, local residents, and displaced people. Scored at 0.33 points for each of the three groups.

Response: Yes for alumni and local community; provision for displaced people and refugees is not currently a distinct programme.

This indicator splits the existence point three ways, so it is worth being explicit about which groups the University reaches and which it does not. Alumni and local community provision are both well evidenced. Provision specifically directed at displaced people and refugees is not, and the report does not claim otherwise.

Alumni

The University maintains an alumni page, an alumni activities record and an online alumni registration form. Its alumni list is genuinely remarkable for an Indian state university, including two former Presidents of India, two former Prime Ministers, a former Defence Minister and the current National Security Advisor, alongside a substantial number of serving and former Vice-Chancellors of other universities. That network is an asset for outreach that the University has begun to use more systematically, though the alumni engagement programme is still developing relative to the size of the constituency.

Local community

Local provision is the strongest of the three. Community Radio 90.4 FM broadcasts educational programming on health, nutrition, agriculture and civic matters directly into the settlements around the Khandari campus. The University Model School provides school education for neighbourhood families on campus. NSS units run adoption programmes in surrounding villages and wards. The K. M. Munshi Archival Heritage Museum, with its virtual museum, opens the University's manuscript holdings to the public and to scholars beyond Agra. The e-Counselling service supports students across the region in preparing for competitive examinations, and the Rozgar Mela and Students Mega Job Fair connect the wider community to employment.

The affiliating structure amplifies all of this. Around two hundred colleges across seven districts sit under the University, and provision developed centrally reaches students and communities well beyond the four campuses.

Displaced people and refugees

The University does not currently run a programme directed specifically at displaced people or refugees, and this is recorded as a gap rather than presented as covered by general community provision. Agra district does host migrant and internally displaced populations, and the Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Institute of Rural Development together with the NSS units would be the natural vehicles if the University chose to develop targeted provision. Annexure D records this as a development opportunity worth 0.33 points on this indicator.

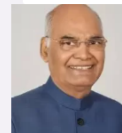

17.4.4 Sustainability literacy

Indicator: Measurement of students' ability to learn and retain key concepts of sustainability. Collected in 2026 to inform future methodology; not scored this cycle.

Response: Not currently measured as a distinct instrument.

The University does not at present run a dedicated sustainability literacy assessment. Sustainability content is assessed within the courses that carry it, through the ordinary examination system administered by the Controller of Examinations, but there is no separate instrument that measures whether students across the institution have absorbed and retained key sustainability concepts.

Since this indicator is unscored in 2026 but explicitly flagged as informing future methodology, the sensible response is to develop something modest now rather than to wait. The IQAC already operates a feedback and survey infrastructure, including student feedback forms and the Viksit Bharat survey run through the examinations portal, and a short sustainability literacy instrument could be attached to the existing feedback cycle at low cost. Doing so in the current year would put the University ahead of the requirement when it becomes scored.
