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INTRODUCTION

The foundation of Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar University (originally known as Agra University) was laid on the 1st of July, 1927, as a result of hectic efforts of a band of enthusiastic educationists like Rev. Canon A.W. Davis, Munshi Narain Prasad Asthana, Dr. L.P. Mathur, Lala Dewan Chand, Rai Bahadur Anand Swaroop and Dr. Brajendra Swaroop. Rev. Canon A.W. Davis was the first Vice Chancellor of Agra University.

Original jurisdiction of University extended over United Provinces of Agra, Central India and Rajputana with 14 affiliated colleges and students of which, 1475 students belonged to United Provinces. Initially, there were only four faculties in the University viz. Arts, Sciences, Commerce and Law. Faculties of Medicine (1936), Agriculture (1938), Home Science (1980), Basic Sciences (1981), Fine Arts (1982) and Management (1993) were added subsequently.

The Agra University, Agra was renamed as Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar University, Agra from 24.09.1995 vide U.P. Govt. Notification No. 33/XVII-V-1-1(ka)-43-1996, dated 06.01.1996. The University now caters to the educational need of the seven districts of Agra Division namely Agra, Aligarh, Mainpuri, Hathras, Firozabad, Etah and Mathura. Besides, the University is proud of having affiliated to it, Sarojini Naidu Medical College, which is one of the oldest and a premier Medical Institute of the country. At present university has approx 200 affiliated colleges and 15 residential Institutes spread out in its four residential campus viz. Paliwal Park, Khandari Campus, Civil Lines Campus and Chhaleshar Campus. Furthermore, this university affiliates colleges of Homeopathy, Ayurveda extending all over the State of U.P.

The University is steadily surging ahead as a centre for higher scientific vocational and job oriented education and innovative research. The goal of the University is to innovate in the field of education and to become a centre of excellence both nationally and internationally. The University is not only confined to impart quality education but also to satisfy the burning desire of the students who are exploring the creative intellect. The University is making every effort to fulfill the spirit of University motto "Tamo Sa Jyotirgamay" moving from darkness to light.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR ADMISSION

1. In Academic Session 2021-22 all admission in University will be done through Single Admission Monitoring system.
2. Through University Admission Monitoring system, every eligible student/applicant can register themselves for more than one course in single registration fees. Students can also opt for their desired college according to the availability of the seats.
3. For admission in University, Eligible Students/Applicants can apply through University Official Website www.dbrau.org.in.
4. All admission related instructions, guidelines, notices, prospectus etc. are available on University official website.
5. In case the student has submitted an application for leaving the course in between within two months from the date of taking the admission, the University will reimburse 90% of the total fees.

GUIDELINES FOR ADMISSION

Online applications shall be invited for admission to Under-Graduate courses being run in the Residential Wing/Affiliated Colleges of the University. Eligibility criteria for admission shall be specified on the University Website www.dbrau.org.in.

- Information of the admission procedure shall be displayed on the University website www.dbrau.org.in. Candidates are advised to check the University website regularly for updates.
- Candidates may note that any discrepancy regarding fee or eligibility criteria or any other alike due to printing or any other kind of error shall not provide any right to the candidates for admission to any particular course. The candidate shall be required to pay the actual fee applicable for the course at the time of admission.
- The applicant is required to ensure that he/she has checked the eligibility criteria of the course concerned and correctly filled up the application form. Admission shall be cancelled if the candidate is not found to be eligible.
- Reservation Rules for the admission shall be applicable as per U.P. Government Rules.
- The University reserves the right not to conduct any self-financing courses in residential wing/affiliated colleges if sufficient number of applications/students are not available. In such cases the fee of the applicant shall be refunded.
- After being admitted to any course, if a candidate fails to submit his/her eligibility certificate within the stipulated time his/her admission will be liable to be cancelled and the candidate shall solely be responsible for cancellation and fee shall not be refunded.
- Any fee structure may be changed at any time as per the guidelines or norms of the Hon'ble Court/Government/University without any prior information or notice to the candidate and deposition of the same fee shall be binding upon the candidate.
- Minority Institution will take admission as per the prevailing rules of the UP Government/University.
- Changed made, if any, in the admission rules/fee structure of any course shall be applicable to candidate seeking admission even after registration. No separate intimation letters will be sent.
- Check University Admission Committee minutes for rules and regulations, weightage

marks etc. The Rules for admission as prescribed by the Admission Committee of the University for the session 2021-22 shall strictly be followed for weightage marks etc.

- Application forms shall be rejected in case:-
 1. It has been received after last date; and
 2. It has been received with invalid or incomplete documents. No correspondence shall be entertained in this regard.

The University courses are categorized:

Regular Courses:

Where the faculty positions are substantive capacity and duly approved by the UGC/ State Government. For these courses, permanent faculty will be engaged in teaching and in case of any vacancy, guest faculty may be recruited against those posts.

Self-Finance Courses:

These courses are approved by State Government, but not funded by State Government. These are self-sustaining courses. The funds are generated out of fee collection from the students to take admission in the course. The faculty/Staff position are not substantive in nature. In these courses teaching positions are of two natures, (a) contractual faculty and (b) visiting faculty. The vacant positions, not filled up by contractual faculty, shall be filled up by appointing visiting faculty. Such visiting faculty shall be appointed as per the norms of the University, on the payment of Rs. 25,000/- to Rs. 45,000/- depending on the financial resources of the course concerned.

RESERVATION OF SEATS

Reservation of Seats shall be as per the guidelines of State Government announced time to time, provided that the candidate should produce valid certificates duly signed by competent authority and issued on or after the 1st April of the Academic Year.

- **Experiential Learning:** DBRAU emphasizes experiential learning through a pedagogy that integrates hands-on training, field postings, “laboratory practice, training facility, providing students with extensive opportunities to apply theoretical knowledge in authentic healthcare settings while developing professional competence”.
- **Faculty Support and Mentorship:** The University is supported by a team of experienced and qualified faculty members committed to academic excellence and student development. To provide personalized guidance, DBRAU has implemented a **Mentor–Mentee Programme**, through which faculty mentors support students in academic progress, skill enhancement, career planning, and personal development, fostering a supportive learning environment.
- **Career-Oriented Skill Development:** DBRAU places significant emphasis on enhancing graduate employability through structured career development initiatives. The University facilitates internships, placement assistance, and industry engagement through its dedicated Placement Cell. In addition, the **Centre for Professional and Communication Enrichment (C-PACE)** equips students with essential communication, leadership, interpersonal, and professional skills, preparing them to excel in competitive workplaces and contribute effectively to society

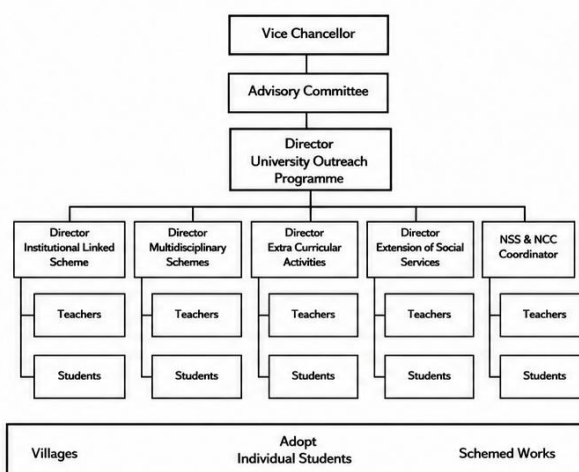

The University's research output shows a marked increase in recent years, with the majority of publications produced during **2024 and 2026**, reflecting a growing institutional emphasis on educational research and continuous quality enhancement. Collectively, these publications have attracted **more than 1346 scholarly views**, indicating substantial academic visibility and engagement within the global research community. The portfolio records an **average CiteScore of approximately 3.4**, with the highest **CiteScore of 14.3** achieved by a publication in the journal *Studies in Higher Education* (2025), demonstrating the international quality and impact of DBRAU's educational research.

DBRAU's research encompasses a broad spectrum of themes that support the objectives of **SDG 4**, including **competency-based education, blended and technology-enabled learning, artificial intelligence in education, inclusive education for learners with disabilities, quality assurance and**

accreditation frameworks, faculty development, professional competency enhancement, digital pedagogy, and graduate employability. Collectively, these research efforts contribute to the development of innovative educational practices, strengthen institutional quality assurance mechanisms, and promote equitable access to quality education for diverse learner populations.

Through sustained scholarly engagement, interdisciplinary collaboration, and a strong focus on educational transformation, DBRAU continues to contribute to national and international efforts aimed at improving learning outcomes, fostering inclusive education, and advancing excellence in teaching, research, and professional development.

4.1.2. Quality Education: CiteScore

Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar University Agra (DBRAU) demonstrates a strong commitment to **Sustainable Development Goal 4 (SDG 4): Quality Education** through impactful research that advances pedagogical innovation, digital learning, competency-based education, and inclusive educational practices. Between **2015 and 2026**, the University produced **69 Scopus-indexed publications** in internationally recognized journals, books, and conference proceedings, reflecting its sustained contribution to improving the quality, accessibility, and effectiveness of higher and professional education.

DBRAU's educational research has been published in leading scholarly outlets, including *Studies in Higher Education* (**CiteScore 14.3**), *Diagnostics* (**4.7**), *BMC Medical Education* (**5.7**), and the *Indian Journal of Pediatrics* (**1.8**). These publications address contemporary challenges in education by promoting evidence-based teaching practices, technology-enabled learning environments, curriculum innovation, competency-based assessment, and inclusive educational frameworks.

The University's publication portfolio exhibits a **CiteScore range from 0.3 to 14.3**, with a **median CiteScore of approximately 3.5–4.0**, demonstrating a balanced distribution of research across both high-impact international journals and specialized disciplinary publications. High-impact contributions published in *Studies in Higher Education* and *Diagnostics* underscore DBRAU's growing international research visibility and its ability to influence educational policy, practice, and innovation at both national and global levels.

Collectively, these research outputs highlight DBRAU's academic rigor, interdisciplinary collaboration, and commitment to advancing educational excellence through scholarly inquiry. The University's work has significantly contributed to the development of competency-based curricula, digital and technology-enhanced learning, faculty capacity building, inclusive education, and quality assurance in higher education.

Quality Education: FWCI

Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar University Agra (DBRAU) has demonstrated increasing global research influence through the citation performance of its publications aligned with **Sustainable Development Goal 4 (SDG 4): Quality Education**. The University's **Field-Weighted Citation Impact (FWCI)** for SDG 4-related publications ranges from **0.4 to 6.7**, reflecting a diverse research portfolio that combines locally relevant educational studies with internationally recognized scholarly contributions.

Several publications have achieved exceptional citation performance relative to global benchmarks. Notably, articles published in *Diagnostics* (**FWCI ≈ 6.7**) and *BMC Medical Education* (**FWCI ≈ 5.7**) have received citation rates substantially above the world average for their respective fields. These high-impact studies have contributed to advancing knowledge in areas such as **artificial intelligence–assisted education, technology-enabled and blended learning, competency-based medical education, clinical skills development, and innovative pedagogical approaches**, highlighting DBRAU's growing influence in educational research.

Across the available dataset, the University's SDG 4 publications achieve an **average FWCI of approximately 3.7**, indicating that these research outputs are cited **more than twice the global average** for comparable publications in the same disciplines. This performance demonstrates the quality, relevance, and international recognition of DBRAU's educational research and reflects its ability to produce evidence that informs teaching practice, curriculum innovation, and higher education policy.

The strong citation performance of DBRAU's SDG 4 research underscores the University's commitment to academic excellence, interdisciplinary collaboration, and educational innovation. By generating high-quality, impactful research with global relevance, DBRAU continues to strengthen its international research visibility and reinforces its role as a significant contributor to evidence-based educational transformation, inclusive learning, and the advancement.

This multidisciplinary approach enables DBRAU to generate evidence-based solutions that enhance professional education, promote community health literacy, and improve equitable access to quality learning.

1. Research in Educational Pedagogy and Technology

A significant component of DBRAU's SDG 4 research focuses on evaluating and enhancing teaching methodologies to improve student learning outcomes and professional competence. Faculty members

conduct educational research that informs curriculum design, instructional practices, and technology-enabled learning across healthcare and allied disciplines.

 - ✓ Field-based practicums and community immersion programmes;

The findings from these studies support continuous curriculum improvement and contribute to the adoption of evidence-based teaching practices that enhance student engagement, practical skill development, and graduate readiness.

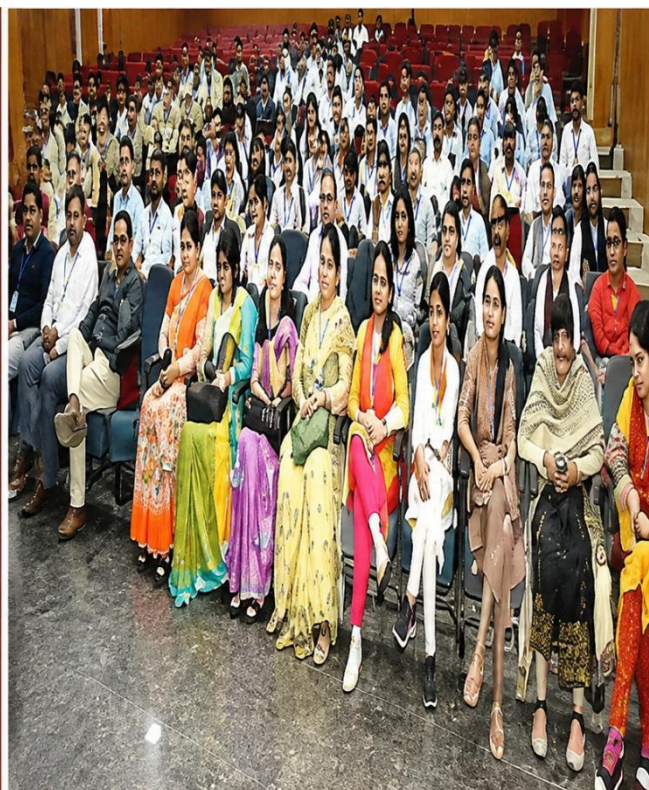
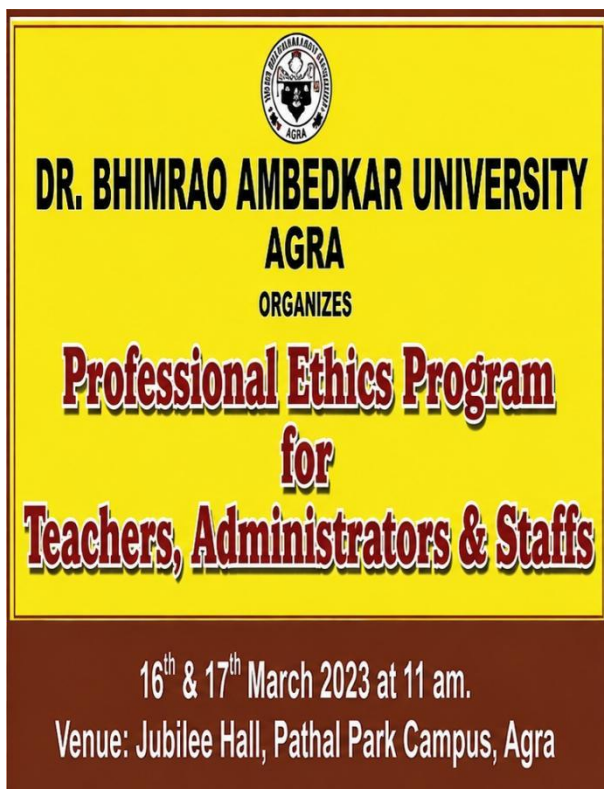

- **Short-Term Certificate Programmes:** To enhance employability and support lifelong skill acquisition, DBRAU offers a range of short-term, industry-oriented certificate programmes. Courses such as the Certificate in Hotel Operations provide practical, employment-focused training that enables learners with secondary education qualifications to acquire market-relevant competencies and improve career prospects within a relatively short period.
- **Workshops, Seminars, and Emerging Technologies:** The University maintains a vibrant academic environment by regularly organizing interdisciplinary workshops, expert lectures, seminars, conferences, and training programmes on emerging topics including artificial intelligence, machine learning, digital technologies, innovation, research methodology, and gamified teaching and learning. and discussed technical aspects, operational challenges, and applications of instrumentation in different research areas.



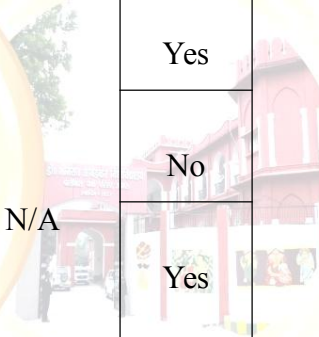

Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar University Agra (DBRAU) is committed to extending the benefits of education beyond its enrolled student community by providing a range of free educational resources, vocational training programmes, public health education initiatives, and knowledge-sharing platforms for the general public. These initiatives, primarily delivered through the Rural Development Institute (RDI), the Department of Community Medicine, and the Central Library, support lifelong learning, community empowerment, and equitable access to educational opportunities in alignment with Sustainable Development Goal 4 (SDG 4): Quality Education.

1. Free Vocational and Skill Development Programmes

The Rural Development Institute (RDI) operates a dedicated Skill Development Centre that provides free vocational and employability-oriented training to rural youth and economically disadvantaged communities. These programmes are designed to enhance practical competencies, promote entrepreneurship, and improve employment prospects through industry-relevant skill development.

Training programmes include vocational courses in:

➤ Awareness Lecture and Motivational Talk on Army Recruitment

- **Workshop on CV Building and HR Interview Skills:** A workshop on “How to Build CV as per Market Demands and Ace HR Interview Process” was organized on 23 March 2026 at 12:30 PM at UCC-Room 1, University Computer Centre, Institute of Basic Science, Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar University, Swami Vivekanad Parisar, Khandari, Agra. 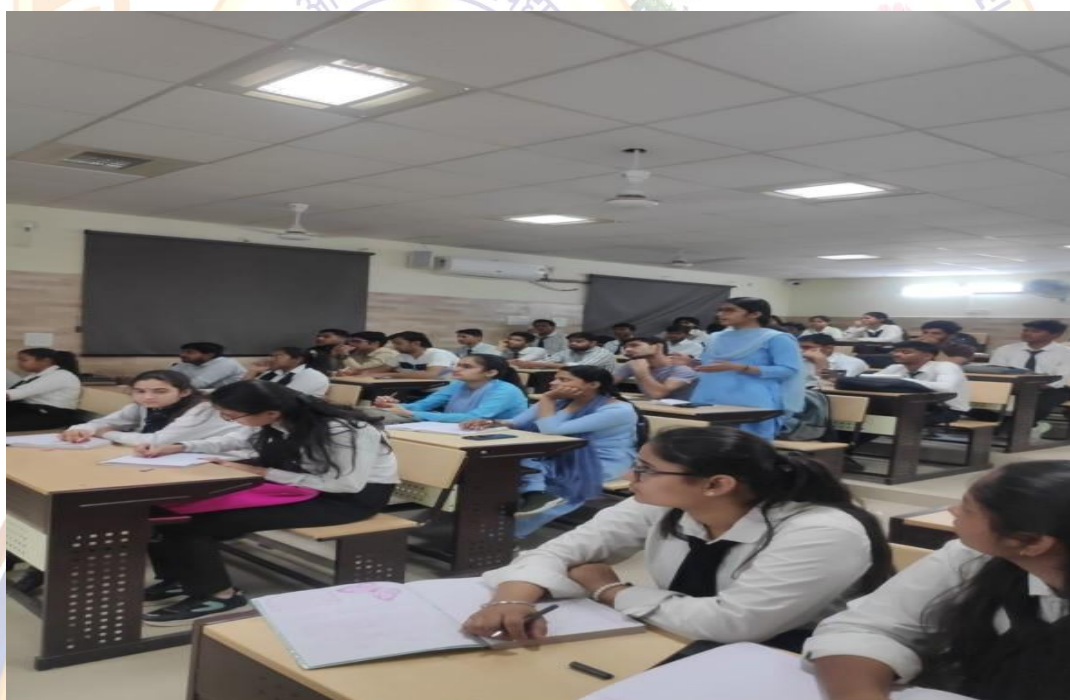

2. Public Health and Wellness Education

Community Health and Public Awareness Programmes

As part of its commitment to Sustainable Development Goal 4 (SDG 4): Quality Education, Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar University Agra (DBRAU) regularly organizes community-oriented educational programmes that

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Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar University Agra (DBRAU) and its constituent bodies conduct extensive educational outreach activities beyond the campus, targeting local schools and the wider community. These activities often involve both faculty and students. These initiatives are primarily led by the university's Department of Community Medicine, the Rural Development Institute (RDI), and the college of Pharmacy.

1. On Programmed Basis

DBRAU runs several large-scale, long-term educational outreach programs. These are institutionalized, regular activities, often managed by dedicated departments like the Rural Development Institute (RDI) and the Department of Community Medicine.

School Health & Education (RDI): The Rural Development Institute runs continuous, long-term programs for local schools. This includes providing "Health education to over 10,000 school students" and a long-running, regular program for adolescents that has reached over 110,000 individuals.

Non-Formal Education (RDI): The RDI has been operating a "Flying Birds school" since 1990, providing non-formal education to marginalized children. <https://DBRAU.edu.in/allied-units/>

Community Medicine Outreach: The Department of Community Medicine runs three permanent outreach health centers. Its staff and students conduct regular "school health weeks" to teach about lifestyle diseases and observe Public Health Days "every year" in the community.

Student-Service Schemes (NSS): The university's National Service Scheme (NSS) units engage in regular, programmed community work. This includes "Adoption of Villages" and organizing activities like "World Health Day in village" as part of their standard calendar.

- The National Service Scheme (NSS) plays an important role in developing social responsibility, community awareness, and a spirit of volunteerism among students. The institution has two NSS units, each comprising 100 volunteers, who actively participate in various social welfare and community development programmes.

Major NSS Activities: The NSS volunteers are involved in a range of activities aimed at improving public health, cleanliness, and social awareness. Major activities include:

- Health Camps: Volunteers assist in organizing health camps to promote health awareness and provide basic health services to the community.
- Aadhaar Camps: NSS units support Aadhaar-related camps to help people access essential identity documentation services.
- Blood Donation Camps: Volunteers participate in organizing and promoting blood donation drives to support hospitals and patients in need.

- **Vaccination Camps:** NSS volunteers contribute to vaccination programmes by assisting with awareness campaigns and camp management.
- **Say No to Polythene Campaign:** Awareness activities are conducted to encourage people to reduce the use of polythene and adopt environmentally friendly alternatives.
- **Fit India Run:** Volunteers participate in fitness and awareness programmes under the Fit India initiative, encouraging healthy and active lifestyles.
- **Swachh Bharat Abhiyan:** NSS members actively participate in cleanliness drives and spread awareness about sanitation, waste management, and maintaining a clean environment.

Community Adoption: As part of its social commitment, the NSS units have also adopted an underprivileged society near the school at Bapu Nagar. Through this initiative, volunteers work to understand the needs of the local community and support activities related to cleanliness, health, education, and social awareness.



Impact of NSS Activities: The activities conducted by the NSS units provide valuable support to the local community while also giving students practical opportunities to serve society. Participation in these programmes develops leadership, teamwork, communication skills, social responsibility, and awareness of community issues among volunteers. The NSS units, with a combined strength of 200 volunteers, are making meaningful contributions through health, cleanliness, environmental, fitness, and community welfare programmes.



Water Conservation Day

Water Conservation Day was observed with the objective of creating awareness among students and the community about the importance of water conservation and sustainable use of water resources. The programme highlighted the increasing demand for water and the need to prevent its unnecessary wastage. During the programme, participants were made aware of simple and effective measures for saving water in their daily lives. 3. Ad Hoc Basis

The university's programmed activities are supplemented by numerous ad-hoc events. These are typically onetime or event-specific lectures, demonstrations, and camps designed to address a specific need or raise awareness.

- **Nukkad Natak (street play) on “Say No to Plastic”:** The Institute of Home Science, Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar University, Agra organized an extension activity in the form of a Nukkad Natak (street play) on “Say No to Plastic” on 03 August 2021 at Sonari Village.

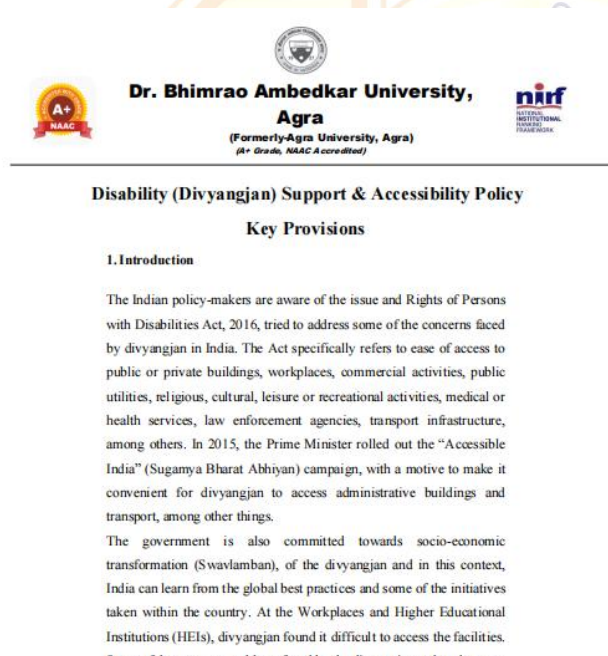

A special reading hall/common room on ground floor in the main building of the University is available for differently-able students along with assistive software (screen reading) and other equipment's. Scribes and additional time are provided at the time of examination as per norms. Divyangjan-friendly wheelchairs, vehicles and equipment is provided to employees/students as per their requirements.

a) Ramps and Lift facilities

Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar University Agra (DBRAU) actively aligns with SDG 4 (Quality Education) through a comprehensive, multi-pronged strategy. This is formalized by its "Policy for Lifelong Learning" which promotes inclusive, equitable, and continuous learning for all. DBRAU ensures quality teaching by graduating specialized educators, particularly in nursing and yoga, and by publishing Scopus-indexed research on innovative pedagogy and blended learning. The university champions lifelong learning by offering free vocational training and skill development programs to the public via its Rural Development Institute (RDI). **Policy for Quality Education for Academic Flexibility for Faculty Members,
Academicians and Researchers**

1. Short Title and Commencement

- This Policy shall be called the "**Policy on Academic Flexibility for Faculty Members, Academicians and Researchers**" of Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar University, Agra.
- This Policy shall come into force from the date of its approval by Executive Council the University.

2. Preamble

- Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar University, Agra recognizes that academic freedom and flexibility are fundamental to excellence in teaching, learning, research, innovation, and knowledge creation. The University is committed to creating an academic environment that encourages intellectual inquiry, academic excellence, interdisciplinary collaboration, critical thinking, innovation, holistic development and ethical research practices.
- This Policy seeks to provide faculty members, academicians, researchers, postdoctoral fellows, visiting scholars, and research students with appropriate academic flexibility while ensuring accountability, academic integrity, and compliance with applicable laws, University Grants Commission (UGC) Regulations, National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, and the Statutes and Ordinances of the University.

3. Purpose

The objectives of this Policy are to:

- Strengthen academic freedom in teaching, research, innovation, publication, and scholarly activities.
- Encourage interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary teaching collaborations and research projects.
- Incorporate innovative curriculum design, research methodologies, and knowledge dissemination.
- Facilitate and strengthen national and international academic collaborations, faculty exchange, and research partnerships.

- Promote ethical, responsible, and socially relevant research.
 - Create an enabling ecosystem for academic excellence, innovation, and continuous professional development.

4. Scope

This Policy shall apply to:

- Regular, contractual, and adjunct faculty members.
- Professors, Associate Professors, Assistant Professors, and Academic Fellows.
- Research Scholars and Postdoctoral Fellows.
- Visiting Faculty, Visiting Scientists, Visiting Scholars, and Experts.
- Project Staff engaged in research and innovation activities.
- Undergraduate and Postgraduate students involved in approved research projects.

5. Policy Objectives

The University shall endeavour to:

- Protect academic freedom while maintaining institutional responsibility and academic ethics. Encourage innovative teaching-learning practices consistent with Outcome-Based Education (OBE) and NEP 2020.
